BULLYING (p. 1, 2 and 3)

With Christy Clark's announcement of a new anti-bullying plan for B.C. schools, with stories of bullying abound, and with a new school year upon us, we thought featuring this age-old problem was timely.

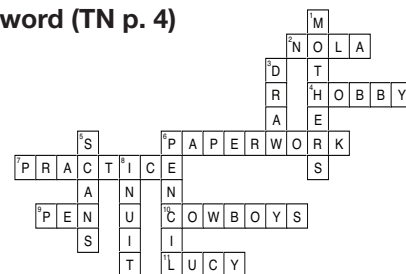
