1. Send *The Westcoast Reader* your questions

2. Voting and polls on our website

IKEA comes from the name and hometown of its founder. Ingvar **K**amprad grew up in **E**lmtaryd, **A**gunnaryd (Sweden).

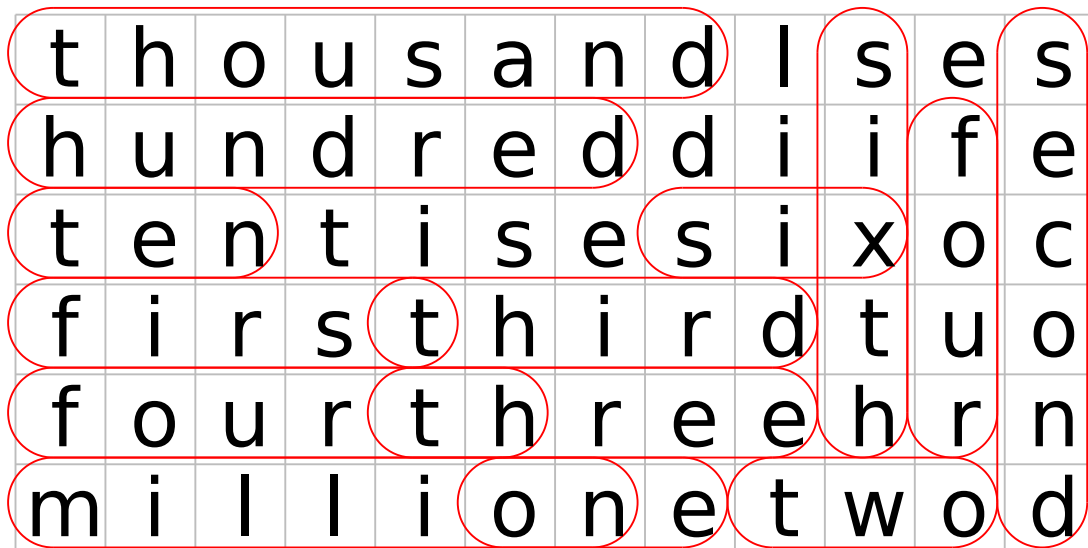

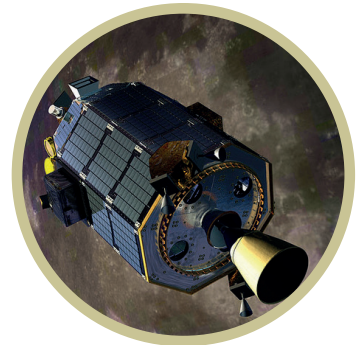
